Flooring Fundraiser UPDATE: 3 Weeks Remain! 6/1-7/16



UPDATE: Trinity's garden is blooming! To date, the flooring sprinter fundraiser has raised \$4,300.00. With matching, that is \$8,600! We are almost halfway to the goal which will cover the full cost of new flooring. If you are able to help with the flooring restoration project, consider a contribution before the campaign ends on Sunday, July 16th. Trinity thanks all of you for the gifts received so far.

Goal: The flooring is original to the building construction in 1987 and is very worn. The project total is \$19,000. One of our members has offered to match gifts up to \$6,500. The Session is asking each member to consider making a donation equal to one extra month of donation for this year (i.e. a 13th month for 2023). Members are asked to do this between now and Sunday, July 16th. Please mark your payment as "Sanctuary flooring" if you can make that contri-

bution now, or if you need to do it later after July 16th, please notify the church office of your intent to contribute before the end of the year.

How to give: When you give a gift, a flower blossom and green leaf are added to the garden banners on your behalf. Your name/family name will be on the leaf (unless you request to remain anonymous). Monetary amounts are private. Look for the four flower banners displayed in the church's main entrance and watch as our garden grows! Church Announcements

The Building & Grounds Committee plans to replace the flooring in the sanctuary. The flooring is original to the building construction in 1987 and is very worn. The cost will be approximately \$19,000. One of our members has offered a gift of about a third of that amount and is challenging the rest of the congregation to donate the remainder. The Session is asking each member to consider making a donation equal to one extra month of donation for this year (i.e. a 13th month for 2023). Members are asked to do this between now

and July 16th. Please mark your payment as "Sanctuary flooring." If you need to do it later than mid-July, please notify the church office of your intent to contribute before the end of the year. Trinity has received a \$5,000 Ministry Imagination Grant from the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area). The grant will be used to offer a series of four speakers who will tell of experiences of their homeland, their refugee journey, and their transition to becoming Minnesota residents. Trinity's first guest spoke on 6/21, and the remaining three will speak at Trinity in July and August.

Trinity has invited the larger community through social media and a direct mailing postcards to those living within 1.5 miles of Trinity.

Trinity has installed several rain gardens in the past. Some of the members who have cared for these gardens have left Trinity and Woodbury. If you have interest in volunteering to serve in this manner, please contact Rita Thomas, chair of the Building & Grounds Committee. Training is available.

Pastor April resumes her Sabbatical this on September 10. She returns to the office November 6.

Embracing Our Neighbors - Four Speaker Series Coming To Trinity

In the recent past, Trinity has been deeply moved to support the newest neighbors in our midst, refugees from other countries. In partnership with the Minnesota Council of Churches Refugee Services, Trinity has collected and filled 25 buckets with cleaning supplies, valued at \$1500, to support refugees from Afghanistan who have settled in the Twin Cities. In addition, Trinity collected 35 pillows, and provided new pillow covers to those who arrived in the Twin Cities with only a suitcase and a heart full of hope.

7/12 - Speaker #2, Edward Mwakana is a preacher and teacher from the Democratic Republic of Congo. After fleeing their country in 2003, he and his wife spent the next 15 years in refugee camps in Namibia until they, along with their four children, arrived in the United States in 2018. Edward's background includes studies in Latin, philosophy, law and theology. He continuously gives back to his new Minnesota community by serving as an interpreter for new refugee arrivals in more than five languages.

8/2 - Speaker #3, Hawra Alnabi is an Iraqi American who was born in the village of Al-Fahood in southern Iraq. In 1991, her family joined the uprising against Saddam Hussein and was forced to flee for safety. After living in a refugee camp in northern Saudi Arabia with 30,000 other families for five years, her family came to the U.S. in 1996 when Alnabi was 8 years old. They then moved to MN in 1997 for better job opportunities. She's currently the operations coordinator at Education Evolving, a small nonprofit organization. She is a wife and a mom to a 14 year old boy and a 3 year old girl.

8/23 - Speaker #4, Sahar Karimi was part of the horrendous, emergency evacuation from Kabul Airport, Afghanistan, in August 2021. At age 16, along with her parents, 3 siblings and cousin, she left her entire life behind as she fled to the airport hoping to secure a place on a plane that would take her to safety. After a period of processing at an American airbase in Germany, she and her family were flown to Fort McCoy, WI where they awaited matching with a resettlement agency. She now calls MN her new home, and fully embraces every opportunity to create a future that is full of hope.

MCC Refugee Services has had a busy season for welcoming refugees. The shelves in their donation room have been clearing much faster than they would like.

Earlier in June, Trinity's Mission & Action Committee purchased items that are of urgent need at the MCC Refugee Services Center. These purchased items were picked up by MCC's Kathryn Berger on 6/13. The donation totaled \$550.00, and will help and support our newest neighbors, making them feel at home more quickly.
