Josh Heikkila spoke in Trinity's fellowship hall on the evening of Tue., 11/28 from 7-8:30pm. He shared pictures and videos

of the beauty, joy, and challenges of life in West Africa, as seen through the ministry and mission that the Presbyterian Church USA undertakes with partner Presbyterian denominations in West Africa.

Rev. Josh Heikkila is PC(USA)'s regional liaison for West Africa. Appointed as a PC(USA) mission coworker in October 2009, he facilitates



and supports the programs, relationships and activities PC(USA) has with

partners in the region. He also provides support to other PC(USA) mission personnel and helps connect partner churches with PC(USA) congregations that want to be involved in ministry and mission together. Josh was raised in New Jersey and worked at churches in Chicago and St Paul, Minnesota before being sent to Ghana in 2009 by Presbyterian World Mission.

There are those activities that are obvious, such as the Generosity Pledge Drive that has recently been completed (I know, none of us like to be asked for donations, but that's the only way we must provide for the mission and ministry of Trinity Church.) The Covid Pandemic and its aftermath have not been kind to nonprofits in general, and this is true for Trinity. During the time we had only online worship services, some of our members drifted away and have not returned. "Recruiting" new members is a difficult task especially in our society that often downplays religion.

Another activity that isn't as visible to all is the development of a budget for the upcoming year based on the results of the pledges received from members. Based on some rising costs and stagnant or decreasing income projections, our first draft of the 2024 budget showed a deficit of over \$40,000. Trinity doesn't have large reserves from past year surpluses that we can carry a deficit like that. With some penny pinching, the second draft budget with a deficit of about \$34,000 (still unacceptable). We decided to table that discussion until January. Then, unexpectedly, we received word of an unexpected, planned donation that will help us pay off the mortgage on the church building early in 2024 and appears to wipe out our deficit for 2024. (Our mortgage expense in the draft budget is a little over \$52,000 for the year.) Hallelujah!

Another hidden activity of a Session committee is maintaining our building and the grounds. As our building ages, it is getting more expensive to maintain. This past summer we replaced the flooring in the sanctuary. We are in the process now of replacing the lighting in the parking lot. We are hoping to rebuild the aging parking lot in 2024 because any further delay will make the project much more expensive. We need to complete the replacement of the building siding. And we know that the furnaces and air conditioning units will need to be replaced before long (I think I was told we have 8 HVAC units in our building!) All these projects will need assistance from the congregation and possible new loans to complete. (At this point our Jewish friends would use the term Oy Vey!)

There are many other activities of your Session, some of which are visible to all and many that are not. We need the assistance of every member. Please keep in mind that there is a lot more to being a faithful member than just attending weekly worship services (although that is #1, of course!).

As always, the Session appreciates each of our members and friends and encourages feedback on the mission and ministry of Trinity Presbyterian Church. Please consider joining one of our committees! Also, when the Nominating Committee seeks dedicated, imaginative leaders to serve on the Session, we hope that you will give serious consideration to serving in this manner. You can even suggest your own name to the committee. (Hint: Don Breckle is the chair of the committee. Get to know him!)



1/7 - Epiphany Star Words

During worship on, Sun., 1/7 for Epiphany, Trinity will share an activity called Epiphany Star Words. What are Star Words? The use of star words, also called "star gifts," is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany and the new year that has been growing in popularity in Protestant churches for nearly a decade now. The idea is that a list of intention words, or guiding words, are written or printed on paper stars. At some point during your

Epiphany service, individuals are invited to draw a word from the basket, and to use that word as a guiding word throughout the year. Typically, participants are encouraged to trust the word they have drawn, and not to replace the word. However, there is not a strong need to be the "star police" if an individual wants to trade. Individuals are often encouraged to place their star word somewhere they will see it regularly throughout the year to allow consistent reflection on how God has moved through, around, or in connection to that word. If you feel led, start a Star Word journal. As you pray and contemplate your word, note your experiences. A future opportunity to share your story will be offered.
